Photograph and Video Consent

Taking photographs and videos of children and young people

Frosterley Primary School recognises its responsibility to ensure the welfare and safety of children and young people and to comply with the General Data Protection Regulations 2018. You may wish to refer to our privacy notice on our website, which explains how we use your data, and your rights and responsibilities.

We use photographs and videos for a number of reasons including celebrating and recording children's successes. These images or videos may be used on display boards, screens and on our website and our social media site. Your child's identity will not be disclosed without your consent and only if the photograph is used to celebrate individual success.

Photographs and videos will only be recorded on school owned equipment and will not be kept for longer than is to be considered necessary and, in any event, not exceeding a maximum of three years after your child has left the school.

We also believe that it is important for families to celebrate children's successes and, for that reason, at some events we may allow parents/carers to take photographs and videos. We will remind parents/carers prior to the event that any photographs or videos taken should not be uploaded to social media and will explain that some children's safety could be affected.

If you are concerned about the privacy of your child, we would like to encourage you to make an appointment and discuss your concern with Mrs Carr so we can take appropriate measures to protect them.

On some occasions, if we do not have permission to use the image of your child, it may result in your child not being able to take full part in some school events.

Please answer the questions on the attached consent form, then sign and date where shown. Please return the completed form to the school as soon as possible.

It is the parent's/carers responsibility to inform the school if circumstances change and you wish to withdraw consent.
