Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Swimming provision for Y1, 2, 3,4 and 5. • Every swimming lesson is delivered by a qualified swimming coach. • Swimming lessons (and whole school assemblies) increase water safety awareness and training so that every child can apply what they know about water safety and how to help if they, or their friends get into difficulty in or around open water. • Each swimming lesson last one hour per week. • Lessons are differentiated by ability not age and pupils who need additional lessons can access them. For example a Year 6 child who needs further lessons can take part with lower year groups. • Success in swimming is celebrated in weekly school assemblies and newsletters to parents 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Once Covid restrictions allow it, provide additional provision for swimming such as water safety activities at Stanhope open air swimming pool as pupils have accessed in the past.
