<p><i>Week Beginning 20/09/21</i> The /j/ sound spelled with a g Examples: gem, gym, giant, magic, giraffe, energy, digit, engine, religion, gentle, Germany, gymnastics, allergy, apology</p>	<p><i>Week Beginning 27/09/21</i> The /s/ sound spelt c before e, i and y Examples: race, ice, cell, city, fancy, lace, space, circle, circus, rice, pace, nice, cinema, mercy, face, slice</p>
<p><i>Week Beginning 04/10/21</i> The /n/ sound spelt kn and gn Examples: knock, know, knee, knit, knew, knight, kneel, knot, known, knotting, knife, knoll, knitting gnome, gnat, gnaw, gnarled, gnash</p>	<p><i>Week Beginning 11/10/21</i> Challenge Words Examples: door, floor, poor, because, find, kind, mind, behind, child, children</p>

<p><i>Week Beginning 08/11/21</i> The /l/ or /ul/ sound spelled '-le' Examples: table, apple, bottle, little, middle, bubble, cable, uncle, ankle, eagle, fable, topple, fiddle, juggle, double, castle, dazzle, article, poodle, tickle, able, wobble, multiple, riddle</p>	<p><i>Week Beginning 15/11/21</i> The /l/ or /ul/ sound spelt '-el' Examples: camel, tunnel, squirrel, travel, towel, tinsel, hazel, vowel, angel, jewel, trowel, hotel, mantel, peel, level, label, wheel, angel, model, refuel, parcel, bagel, hazel</p>
<p><i>Week Beginning 22/11/21</i> The /l/ or /ul/ sound spelled '-al' Examples: medal, petal, capital, hospital, animal, equal, final, pedal, local, magical, oval, bridal, arrival, oval</p>	<p><i>Week Beginning 29/11/21</i> Words ending in '-il' Examples: pencil, fossil, nostril, pupil, April, gerbil, lentil, evil, anvil, basil, anvil, stencil, peril</p>
